



Inaugural Corporate Hero Luncheon Honors Organization with Over Fifty Years of Service

June 25th, 2015 (Atlanta, GA) – The Atlanta Humane Society hosted a successful inaugural Corporate Luncheon, celebrating both new and current corporate supporters.

The event was held at the Commerce Club on Wednesday, June 17th. The luncheon featured a conversation with Cal Morgan, President & CEO, who just finished his first year leading the organization. WXIA-TV and WATL-TV Anchor/Reporter, Melissa Long served as master of ceremonies and interviewed Morgan.

The interview focused on the mission of AHS and the challenges of ending companion animal homelessness in the Atlanta Community and across Georgia.

“Every year, hundreds of thousands of shelter animals in Georgia are euthanized due to overcrowding. As the largest animal welfare organization in the state, it’s our mission to work with area shelters to not only end companion animal homelessness here at home, but the euthanization of healthy, adoptable animals. “

The event also recognized the inaugural Corporate Hero Award to Constangy, Brooks, Smith and Prophete, LLP. The organization has shown exceptional support of the Atlanta Humane Society and its mission for more than 50 years.

The Constangy family has always been a strong supporter of animals and their well-being. Eleanor Constangy, an Atlanta Humane Society Board member in the 1960s, was responsible for getting her husband’s firm involved with AHS, including providing pro-bono legal services.

In the 1980s, Neill Wasser, Eleanor Constangy’s grandson, began providing legal support to AHS. He carried on the family tradition and joined the AHS Board in the early 2000s.
