## Meet Your Best Friend on the BeltLine Aims for 200 Animal Adoptions in a Single Day

**April 19, 2016 (Atlanta, GA) – Meet Your Best Friend on the BeltLine presented by the maker of Frontline Plus® in collaboration with the Atlanta Humane Society and the Atlanta BeltLine Partnership is bringing together more than twenty animal welfare organizations from across the state for an epic animal adoption event.** The event will bring together many animal rescues and shelters for a one-day adoption event. The goal is to find forever homes for more than 200 adoptable cats, dogs, kittens and puppies.

Atlanta Humane Society will also be providing free microchipping for the first 100 animals, and each microchip after the first 100 will be \$15.

Cal Morgan, President and CEO at Atlanta Humane Society, says hosting the event only helps further the mission of the Atlanta Humane Society.

“As the state’s largest animal welfare agency, part of our role is to unite Georgia shelters and rescue groups in our common goal, and that is ending companion animal homelessness.
